

HEAD STITCHER

OVERVIEW

The Head Stitcher is part of the Costume shop team in the Production Department and will support the execution of costuming elements and needs for all productions at the Fisher Center. Head stitchers sew and finish all assigned costumes. They report to the Costume Shop Supervisor and work closely with other production team members and costume designers.

We are accepting applications from entry-level candidates including current and/or recently graduated students who possess sewing skills and are willing to receive training on specific tasks related to being a stitcher.

This is an in-person, year-round, non-exempt (overtime-eligible), overhire hourly position paid at an **hourly rate range of \$18-\$20/hr** depending on experience. Hours will fluctuate depending on production activity.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- Maintain a safe, healthy, and inclusive workplace at all times.
- Sew assigned costumes by hand or machine.
- Guide stitchers (both student and professional) in tasks.
- Assist in fitting, stitching, or other assigned costume duties
- Perform other duties as assigned by the Costume Shop Supervisor

Company-Wide Responsibilities:

- The Fisher Center is currently undergoing an organization-wide process of change toward becoming an anti-racist, multicultural institution. All on staff are expected to:
